Gordon Tweed, 81, of Northfield, WI, passed away Wednesday, January 15, 2014, at his home, while under the care of Black River Memorial Hospice, Black River Falls, WI.

Gordy was born April 12, 1932 in Northfield, Wisconsin to Arthur and Nellie (Eide) Tweed. He was baptized and confirmed at the Upper Pigeon Creek Lutheran Church. He attended school in Northfield. At an early age he drove milk truck and hauled cattle. Gordon served his country in the Army from 1952 to 1956.

On June 9, 1962 he married Judith Roy in the Wesley Methodist Church in Kenosha. He worked at American Motors (dept.816) in Kenosha, for 31 years. After retiring to Northfield in 1989, he became the custodian of the Upper Pigeon Creek Lutheran Church in 1993 and served until 2009. For many years Gordy enjoyed fishing, hunting, camping and trapping. He also enjoyed recycling aluminum cans. Gordy mowed lawns for the Town of Northfield in summer time and loved driving tractor during haying season for his friend Orland. He was active in his American Legion Post and usually didn't miss daily "coffee shake".

Gordon is survived by his wife, Judith; daughter, DeAnna Tweed; grandchildren, Nathan, Ashley, Kristen Holeva; brother, David (Renee) Tweed; also several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his daughter, Dawn Marie, parents, brother, Robert, sisters Alice (Lavern) Granlund and Karen (Ronald) Johnson.

Funeral services, with military honors, will be held Sunday, January 19, 2014, 1:00 p.m., at Upper Pigeon Creek Lutheran Church, Northfield, WI. Reverend David Christianson will be officiating. Burial will be held at a later date.
